COURSE DESCRIPTION

We will look at some of the momentous innovations in classical music in the twentieth century, specifically in respect to tonality and problems of “form”—in the seminar, as viewed by three major composers—Arnold Schoenberg, Aaron Copland, and George Rochberg—and framed through Roger Scruton’s insightful and accessible (if controversial) book, *Understanding Music*; in the tutorial, as imaginatively configured through Thomas Mann’s great novel, *Doctor Faustus*.

Some familiarity with modern classical music is essential. (Musical expertise will be appreciated.) In addition to the readings listed, we also recommend—and will occasionally refer to: Ross, Alex, *The Rest is Noise*.
