COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course introduces Basic Program alumni to three ancient Indian classics: the *Rigveda*, the *Upanishads*, and the *Bhagavadgita*. The *Rigveda* introduces readers to a world rich with mythic characters and stories, cosmic speculation, chariot warriors, horse sacrifices, cattle-raids, and ritual arcana. The *Upanishads* analyze those rituals and develop ideas like the transmigration of souls, *karma*, and the unity of all things. The *Bhagavadgita*, a philosophical interlude from the epic *Mahâbhârata* (read in the tutorial), presents a conversation between the warrior Arjuna and the god Krishna about *dharma* (duty), touching on the nature of the self and the operations of the universe.
