COURSE DESCRIPTION

This class will explore three of Euripides' plays which feature the voices and portrayal of major women as heroines, in this case on the Trojan side of the Trojan war, all considered with respect to their positions at the end of the war. These plays not only present us with powerful and compelling women, but, written against the political backdrop of the policies of the Athenian empire, Euripides' choice in all three of these plays to focus on the outcomes of the Trojan war, here understood as a war driven by power and wealth (as opposed to a simply just war), provides rich material for thought. We will read the plays closely on their own and in historical context, discussing as many individual passages in class as time allows. Where material is publicly available, we will also integrate discussion of performances of the plays, prioritizing works from the Center for Hellenic Studies. Please read through line 789 of *The Trojan Women* for the first class.
